- exemplary sportsmanship behaviour at all times, including lunch and play times

<p><b>I will:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Remember that the aim of the game is to have fun and improve my skills</li> <li>➤ Be on time</li> <li>➤ Treat opponents and team mates with respect at all times (before, during and after the competition)</li> <li>➤ Make sure I play safe and fair at all times</li> <li>➤ Not shout out at players or referees in anger</li> <li>➤ Set a positive example for others, particularly younger athletes and spectators</li> <li>➤ Think about how I play and not use unsuitable language</li> <li>➤ Play by the rules and display sportsman like conduct</li> <li>➤ Be a good sport and clap good play on both sides</li> <li>➤ Always accept and respect the referee's decision</li> <li>➤ Take care of all property</li> <li>➤ Let a teacher or adult know if others are not following these rules</li> <li>➤ Not wear jewellery, unsuitable clothing or footwear during any event</li> </ul>	<p><b>I will:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Make sure the young people's enjoyment is put first</li> <li>➤ Make sure all arrangements are in place for home matches, including meeting and greeting the opposition</li> <li>➤ Make sure I have all the right paperwork for the event</li> <li>➤ Be a positive role model, will have high standards in my appearance and not use bad language</li> <li>➤ Try to make sure all young players show respect at all times</li> <li>➤ Always respect the referee and thank them, other helpers and opponents after the game</li> <li>➤ Always consider the health, safety and welfare of the players</li> <li>➤ Make sure I praise all athletes from all sides</li> </ul> <p><b>Officials</b></p> <p><b>I will:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Take pride in my appearance and be a positive</li> <li>➤ role model to the young players</li> <li>➤ Be confident in all my decisions</li> <li>➤ Make sure the young players show respect for me</li> <li>➤ and each other</li> <li>➤ Speak to a teacher/adult if I have any problems</li> <li>➤ during the competitions</li> </ul>	<p><b>I will:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Remember that doing one's best and taking part is what is really important</li> <li>➤ Encourage fair play by supporting all players</li> <li>➤ Teach my child to treat players, teachers, coaches and referees with respect</li> <li>➤ Make sure I do not argue with officials and will accept their decisions</li> <li>➤ Not coach my child during games and matches</li> <li>➤ Be a positive role model for my child and set a good example by being a good sport to all sides</li> <li>➤ Never force a child to take part in sport</li> <li>➤ Ensure I do not smoke or drink alcohol as a spectator</li> <li>➤ Make sure my child is dressed properly for the activity and has plenty of water to drink</li> <li>➤ Not swear or use abusive language</li> <li>➤ Never punish or make fun of a child for poor performances or making mistakes</li> <li>➤ Make sure that I am polite to all teachers, coaches and young officials</li> <li>➤ Support my child's involvement and help them enjoy their sport</li> <li>➤ Get permission from the adult in charge to take photographs or video at the event</li> </ul>
